

ISASP Reading Grade 10 Practice Test Constructed Response Rubric

2 pts	<p>Advice connected to traveling to Mallorca is given AND details from both the passage and the table are used to support the explanation. My advice would be to learn Spanish, because the table says that that's what some people on the island easily speak, although in the table it is called Castellano (traditional standard form of Spanish). That said, in the passage, it mentions hearing tourists speak English and German. So, it's not like you would be completely out of luck if you don't know Spanish, but that would be my advice.</p> <p>Advice connected to traveling to Mallorca is given AND details from both the passage and the table are used to support the explanation. I would tell them that Castilian Spanish would be nice to know when travelling to the balearic island of Mallorca, but it would be even better to learn Catalan, because that is the official language of Mallorca. Personally, if this was just for a short trip, I don't think I would try to learn, Mallorqui, because it is only spoken in Mallorca. Unless you fall in love with Mallorca and want to move there, it's not necessary.</p>
1 pt	<p>Advice connected to traveling to Mallorca is given, and details from only the passage are used to support the explanation. Check out the art and food in Mallorca. Mallorca was home to the artist Joan Miro, and people can visit his studio.</p> <p>Advice connected to traveling to Mallorca is given, but no details from the table are used to support the explanation. You should try to learn the languages before you go to Mallorca. Castillian Spanish is the most traditional language you could learn.</p>
0 pts	<p>Advice connected to traveling to Mallorca is given, but insufficient details from the table or the passage are used to support the explanation. Stay for at least a week so you can see everything that it mentioned in the passage and the table. You won't regret your decision. Also, get a window seat on the plane.</p> <p>Claim connected to traveling to Mallorca is given, but insufficient details from the table or the passage are used to support the explanation. Mallorca is a lot of fun! It has a lot to offer. Don't be afraid to try new things!</p> <p>Claim connected to traveling to Mallorca is given, but incorrect details from the table or the passage are used to support the explanation. Be careful when traveling period, but especially if you are traveling to Mallorca. There are pirates that hide in caves there.</p>

General Constructed Response Scoring Guidelines:

- Three to five sentences is considered an appropriate response length to adequately answer a constructed response. However, length does not count toward score. A response that satisfies the criteria for one or two points will earn that score, regardless of length.
- Spelling and grammar (including using complete sentences) do not count toward score. Responses, however, must be clear and understandable.
- Unless it contradicts the rest of the response, extraneous information will not reduce points earned.
